

### **Grant News**

The Scholarships, Endowment and Grants Committee and the Finance Committee jointly determined the funds available to disburse in the 2025 Grant process. We are excited to report that EWPBF was able to grant a \$10,000 Lois Kwasman Grant, a \$15,000 Lois Pope Leadership Grant, and a \$5,000 Community Outreach Grant this year. The funding came from generous individual donations and proceeds from the 2024 and 2025 WILA Luncheons. Thank you to many members and Mrs. Pope whose support made these grants possible. We look forward to your support of the 2026 WILA Luncheon and 2026 FWPBF Grants.

Many thanks to the Grants Committee Co-Chairs, Virginia Spencer and Jackie Halderman and the committee members – Leslie Adams, Dari Bowman, Denise Mariani, Diane McNeal, Mary Lewis Moews, Christine Pitts, and Melissa Sullivan. Three deserving organizations were selected out of a pool of 20 plus applicants. The presentation of the grants occurred at the EWPBF Fall Foundation Lunch on October 23<sup>rd</sup>.

The Caridad Center's Youth Magnolias Program was selected for the 2025 Lois Kwasman Community Impact Grant. The program promotes emotional wellness, leadership, and life skills training for girls 13-17 years of age. Structured social-emotional educational workshops, family engagement activities and community field trips are included.

Milagro Center's Leadership, Empowerment, Achievement Program (LEAP) for girls 12 to 18 years of age was selected for the Lois Pope Leadership Grant. Mrs. Lois Pope joined us to present the grant to Milagro Center's CEO. LEAP fosters personal growth, strategic thinking, and leadership capacity. The girls participating in the program build resilience and self-confidence.

Hands and Feet Inc.'s Supporting Hands Program was selected for the EWPBF Community Outreach Grant. They deliver critical items to foster and biological families with an open child welfare case within 48 hours after a referral is made.

# APR, PRESIDENT, STRATEGIC COMMUNICATIONS



#### **EWPBF Involvement so far:**

Crystal joined EWPB in the summer of 2025 and has attended several events, including the organization's annual meeting, joint networking events, the annual scholarship reception, and fall luncheon. She supports the Outreach Committee and Membership Committee, including being tapped to lead an upcoming Seat at the Table event in early 2026.

#### Tell us a little about your professional journey.

I was working as Director of Public Relations for an agency that I loved, when the founder announced his retirement – so I bought the PR practice from him in 2014. After the leadership transition, I shifted our team's focus from serving clients all over the country to hyperlocal news media and community relations. In addition to securing positive local news coverage for our clients, we also offer our very popular Media Training program.

#### What inspired you to join Executive Women of the Palm Beaches Foundation?

As a female business owner, I know the power of a supportive group of women who face the same challenges and opportunities every day. EWPB caught my attention as an active and engaging group of smart, fun women who could help me as I continue to grow my business, while my decades of experiences help other members.

#### What's one accomplishment you're most proud of?

We recently launched a new On-Demand Media Training option on our website! Our in-person and virtual Media Training Programs are incredibly popular, but we heard from a lot of people over this past year who were unable to join the live sessions scheduled with their organization and requested an 'on-demand' version of our classroom session. I'm so proud of how quickly our PR and web development teams were able to create an on-demand product that meets this need!

#### What advice would you give to other women leaders in Palm Beach County?

My advice to current and future women leaders is to define and own your story, and tell it often. The most influential leaders I know aren't just doing great work; they're communicating it with clarity and purpose. Whether you're speaking at events, to the media, with your employees, or to your community, your messages should reflect your values and vision.

#### What's something fun or surprising about you that most people don't know?

In addition to running a local PR agency, I'm also a certified Disney and Universal travel planner! The systems for each of the parks have become incredibly complicated, and I absolutely love helping people understand it all so they can get the most out of their Disney and Universal vacations. And it doesn't cost them anything! My services for travelers are completely free.
